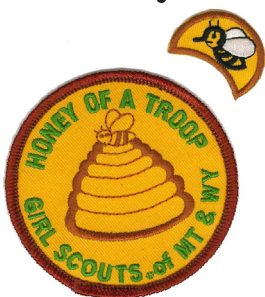


## Honey of a Troop Badge



Service is a way of thinking and doing. That is the focus of this path. It takes five service activities to earn the Bee Hive, and three additional service activities to earn each Bee. Girls may earn patches throughout their Girl Scouting years beginning in Daisies and continuing through Ambassadors. It is recommended that you choose projects from different categories as you work throughout the yearly program.

### Categories are:

#### **Service to Girl Scouting**

Includes those activities that enhance our image or increase our membership. Activities might include recognition of your leader on Leader Appreciation Day, April 22; a letter to the editor about why you like Girl Scouts; a special window display or demonstration; recruit a new member; wearing your uniform when you participate in special ceremonies or programs for the public such as "Take Our Daughters to Work Day," April 28; have a program day when non-Girl Scouts can attend.

#### **Service to your community**

Offer to do a flag ceremony for another group; participate in community cleanup or fix-up days; build a float or march in a parade; participate in a community celebration wearing your Girl Scout uniform or t-shirt.

#### **Service to others**

Plan projects with other groups such as senior citizens organizations, day care providers, nursing homes, Special Olympics, special arts festivals; hostess a special program or holiday party for a special group.

This is only the beginning of what you might do. Girl Scout leaders are the true resources of what can be done for this program. If it improves, helps out, or makes somebody a little happier, it is a SERVICE.
