

Outstanding Girl Scout Troop Patch



This patch recognizes Girl Scout Troops that have supported the Girl Scouts of Montana and Wyoming council product sale programs, given service to their community, increased public awareness of Girl Scouts, conducted meetings using troop government, and have been active throughout an entire Girl Scout year. Troops meeting the requirements will earn the patch with continuing excellence being recognized with a star segment. The Outstanding Troop Patch can be earned by Daisies – Ambassadors. Below is a list of requirements to achieve this "outstanding" patch.

Requirements: Complete six of the twelve activities including those that are starred. These activities must take place during one Girl Scout year. (October 1 through September 30)

1. Register your Girl Scout troop with Girl Scouts of Montana and Wyoming.
- 2.* Participate as a troop in the council-sponsored Fall Nut and Magazine Program and Cookie Program.
3. Attend a Service Unit event or other event that involves Girl Scouts outside your troop.
4. Adopt a younger troop and do at least two different activities with them during the year.
5. Register at least four adults as Girl Scout volunteers with your Girl Scout troop.
- 6.* Do at least two community service projects with your Girl Scout troop.
7. Have your Girl Scout troop wear uniforms or official pins to at least three Girl Scout meetings, events, or activities.
8. Throw a Girl Scout party and have each girl invite a friend who is not a Girl Scout. (Be sure to plan a time to share with your guests what your troop has been doing as Girl Scouts.)
- 9.* Increase public awareness of Girl Scouts by participating in a community event as a Girl Scout troop, having your Girl Scout troop create a public Girl Scout display, or having your Girl Scout troop use the media.
10. Participate in at least two events or activities which celebrate Girl Scout heritage, history, or traditions.
- 11.* Learn about troop government for your Girl Scout's troop age level and use it to conduct your Girl Scout troop meetings.
12. Learn about Girl Scouts of Montana and Wyoming Council and how it supports your Girl Scout troop.
